PROSPECTUS


Loyola Kendriya Vidyalaya, a school affiliated to CBSE Delhi, stands as a beacon of wisdom, hope and transformation for the people of Mysore and surrounding areas. Started and managed by the Fathers of the Society of Jesus, popularly known as the 'Jesuits' since 2014, it carries in being part of a rich legacy of institutions run by Jesuits throughout the world. The Society of Jesus, founded by Ignatius of Loyola in 1540, has a legacy of rendering transformative and emancipatory Education for more than 500 years.

The school is a Christian minority institution intended primarily for the education of the Christian students and managed by the North Karnataka Jesuit Educational and Charitable Society, Mysore. However, students of all religious persuasions are admitted, without any interference with their respective creeds. The President of the Governing body is Rev. Fr. Provincial of the Karnataka Jesuit Province. The Jesuit vision of education, inspired by teaching of Jesus Christ, goes far beyond the achievement of academic excellence. It invites for a radical change in the heart of the one being educated and the educator himself. It means turning from selfish egotism to unreserved generosity to God and their fellow men. It means living out the principles of ethical living, service to others, the search for truth, passion for justice, socially responsible and environmentally caring, through 4 valuable C's of Jesuit formation - Conscience, Competence, Compassion and Commitment, or in two words, "Human Excellence". DISCIPLINARY REGULATIONS

1. Students are expected to be at school by 9:50am regularly.
2. The Morning Assembly begins at 9:30am.
3. The working day is divided into two sessions. The morning session extends from 9:10am to 12:30 pm. The afternoon session from 12:50pm to 4:00 pm.
4. First warning bell for class is given 5 minutes before the commencement of the morning session; and the second bell at the hour fixed for commencement of class.
5. On the arrival of the teacher into the classroom, students must rise and greet the teacher and then get ready for the morning assembly. When the attendance roll is called out each of them must answer to his/her name.
6. No student is allowed to leave the classroom without the permission of the teacher until the class is dismissed.
7. Once inside students will not be allowed to leave the school premises until school closes for the day. The students must leave the school by 4:15pm thereafter must do necessary arrangements for the same.
8. No student/member of staff will be called to the phone during school hours. However in case of emergency the message received on the phone will be conveyed to them.
9. Mobile phones and calculators are strictly prohibited in the School. Items which distract students such as Fancy watches will be confiscated NOT BE RETURNED.
10. Punctual and regular attendance is insisted upon. Marriages, funerals, etc. must be planned during holidays. The general terms of excuse "For some business", or "For absence" should be mentioned.

When a student has been absent from school for some unforeseen reason e.g. illness, he/she must, on returning to School, produce a note of excuse from his/her parent or guardian. If the absence exceeds three days, notice must be forwarded to the Principal and permission obtained.

Leave note should always be written in the space provided in this calendar.

11. Language is matter of habit and practice. All the students especially English Medium students are expected to speak only English when they are in the school campus.
12. Class rooms are reserved for study only and not for any sort of recreation. Students are forbidden from defacinging the walls and furniture by scribbling on them; littering papers in the class rooms or cause any kind of damage the school property.
13. Any kind of damage caused to the equipment, furniture, building, etc. will have to be made good by the student.
14. A student shouldn't enter any class rooms other than his / her own without obtaining permission from the proper authority.
15. Students who fail to show interest and progress in the studies will be asked to leave the school with prior intimation. They must be up to date in their works. The principal may conduct inspection at any time without prior intimation.
16. The school authorities will not be responsible for the safety of the children after the regular school hours.
17. No student shall be promoted to the higher classes to be admitted to the Public Examination unless the student has attended the classes for the required number of working days and has cleared all the dues.
18. Latecomers and absconters should produce leave letter written and signed by the parent or the guardian on the following day when they come to the school. Latecomers are likely to lose attendance for the day.
19. Perfect silence must be observed in the class rooms during the class hours. Running, playing or shouting inside the school building is not permitted. When using the corridors for going to library, Music, Dance and PE classes students shall move in a queue maintaining silence.
20. The School Calendar must be brought to school every day. If one loses the School Calendar a fresh Calendar must be obtained from the school office by paying Rs. 500/- as fine.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Students attending classes or assembling within the school must wear the school uniform as mentioned below:

Girls

- Blue lined blouse and a pin-up from L100 to VI
- Blue lined kameez and navy blue salwar with navy blue coat from VII-X
- Black shoes and navy-blue socks with white lines.
- Long hair - 2 plaits tied up with black ribbon
- Short hair - 2 pony tails with black hair band
- Fancy clips and other such items are not entertained.
- The lower-class students should compulsorily wear knee length patricut, black or blue shorts/tights.
- Staining the nail, hair or skin by any means is not entertained.

Boys

- Blue lined shirt and a navy-blue shorts/ trousers class VI-X
- Black shooes and navy-blue socks with white lines.
- Hair - crew cut
- Vest and briefs must be worn compulsorily.
- Staining the hair or skin by any means is not entertained.

All students are expected to wear shoes compulsorily.

1. A pair of socks-wear denoting the color of the blouse, well-polished black shoes with socks prescribed by the school should be worn on Wednesdays and on special occasions determined by the school. The lineage of the school depends on all students being clean and neatly dressed at all times.
2. Students are expected to wear the SCHOOL UNIFORM prescribed by the school on all working days, School functions, Open house, while representing the school outside the campus for any events, violating which strict disciplinary action will be taken. It also applies to (i) not wearing the issued ID card, (ii) not having (iii) not bringing the issued calendar.
3. On birthdays the students are allowed to wear coloful dress.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

1. Being a minority institution, Christians are given the first preference. However, admission is open to all children irrespective of caste, creed, religion or region.
2. Application form for admission can be obtained from the office on payment of prescribed fee.
3. A child should complete three and half years for Kindergarten and five and half years for Class I, by 31st May while seeking admission. No relaxation in this regard will be made. Parents should note that the Date of Birth entered in the school records will remain the same throughout the academic career of the student.
4. Original Date of Birth certificate and a photocopy thereof, have to be submitted along with the application for admission.
5. Application for admission should be made in prescribed form and should be submitted along with the Transfer Certificate from the school last attended. Every student on admission shall pay the prescribed fees. Regular attendance in classes is a condition for promotion. A student will not be promoted to the next higher classes if his/her attendance falls below 75%.
6. Promotion is based on total performance in the assignments and attendances. The school conducts assessments on regular basis so as to remove low stress and strain in the students. The schedule is in the school calendar.
7. The school working hours are from 8:00a.m to 4:00p.m. Please refer to the school calendar.

WITHDRAWAL

1. Application for Transfer or Conduct Certificate shall be submitted in writing and should be made by the first week of March.
2. Transfer or Conduct Certificate will not ordinarily be issued during vacation.
3. When an application for Transfer Conduct Certificate is made after a lapse of more than one year from the date of which the pupil left school, a special fee of Rs. 100/- shall be charged.

Classes I to X

The school strictly abides by the norms of CGSE which progressively allows more space to "learning outcome based" assessment in place of textbook driven assessment.

One time year-end examination is complimented and supplemented with Internal Assessment (IA) that assesses students in diverse

learning at different times and also examines a broad range of curriculum objectives. IA, in effect school-based assessment, plays the dual role of providing a complete picture of students' abilities or progress towards fulfilling the aims of education and informing teachers' of students' progress and therefore supporting classroom learning. It also informs the individual learner about his/her progress over a period of time enabling them to develop strategies to improve learning.

- Create a study routine. Set a time-table and a quiet place for your child to work every day.

- Build success. Help raise your child's self-esteem by setting reachable goals and praising your child's efforts, not just results.
- Encourage your child to read good books and newspapers, other than the textbooks at least for some time in the day.
- Read any comment the teacher has made on returned assignments.
- Support your child's teacher as they work with your child throughout the year.
- Let your child's teacher know about any situations or conditions at home that may affect your child's ability to concentrate on schoolwork.

- You are 'Ipno Eeti' members of the Parent-Teacher association of the School which aims at fostering close relationship, mutual understanding and co-operation between home and school. You are strongly urged to attend General Body Meeting, parent-teacher meetings, Sports Day, School Day and other functions of the School.
- Kindly pay the fees on time for smooth functioning of the school.
- Help raise your child's sense of pride in making him/her realize that s/he/he is an integral part of the school.
- Please do not give any pocket money or expensive articles to your child while s/he/he comes to school. The school will not be responsible for the loss of any articles or money.
- You are requested to explain the rules of the school to your child.
- Inform the school immediately if there is any change in the address or telephone number.
- Support your child to come neatly dressed to school with proper dress code.
- The belongings of the student should be labeled for easy identification name of the child with class and section.
- Your child must carry a handkerchief and a napkin every day to school.
- Please do not send your ward to school if she/he is suffering from any contagious disease.
- The safety of your child is our priority. In case of emergency the child will be attended and you will be informed at the earliest.
- You can visit your ward's teachers between 3:00 p.m. and 3:30 p.m. on Monday and Wednesday.
- You are not allowed to enter any of the classrooms during the class hours without the Principal's permission.
- Admissions of students to class II and above shall be considered provisional till the Transfer Certificate of the school last attended, is submitted by the parents to the school office.
